Reviewer:

The statement “The internationalization of constitutional law... has not historically received significant attention” is too general. Please support this assertion with a broader literature review or meta-analytical evidence, and clarify the timeframe you mean by “not historically”.

When referencing the rise in United Nations membership from 51 to 193, the manuscript should explicitly connect how this numerical expansion directly contributed to the globalization of constitutional law, rather than just implying correlation.

The claim that “a certain percentage of students now study law abroad” is vague. Please provide data or at least an approximate percentage from recent global legal education reports.

Reviewer:

The discussion is dense but lacks a conceptual diagram or framework. Adding a visual comparative model of these three terms could enhance clarity and conceptual coherence.

The sentence “Jessup intended to give a clear meaning to the term ‘transnational’” should be supplemented with his original definition and its evolution in contemporary scholarship, including counter-arguments.

The notion of a “multilevel scientific community” is introduced without prior definition. Please define what levels are meant (local, national, transnational, global) and how they interact.
